## INTENSIVE SEMINARS IN APPLIED CONTROL THEORY

The Intensive Seminars are designed to teach the principles of Perceptual Control Theory as well as the theory's personal and professional applications. PCT provides a basis for the "Connected School" strategies.

Each four-day, hands-on session includes connecting activities, small group work, discussions, and practice using role-playing and self-evaluation exercises.

Certification is a cumulative, multistep process that helps participants develop and refine analytical and problem-solving skills. To achieve certification, participants must complete ACT I, ACT I Practicum, ACT II, ACT II Practicum, and ACT III. All sessions are led by a qualified IAACT faculty member.

New View offers ACT I, ACT II, and ACT III throughout the year across the United States. IAACT sponsors ACT IV annually in Hilton Head Island, SC, for advanced participants. Each session is briefly described below.

**Applied Control Theory I (ACT I)** introduces PCT and principles derived from the theory, with emphasis on personal self-evaluation and professional applications.

**Applied Control Theory II (ACT II)** further explores the theory, presenting applications and skills which help participants better manage themselves and others.

**Certification (ACT III)** involves a brief presentation and role plays that demonstrate knowledge of PCT and its applications.

**The Loop: Practicum Supervision and Beyond (ACT IV)** offers advanced participants an opportunity to learn more about the theory and join the IAACT faculty.

## INTENSIVE SEMINAR LEADERS

A qualified faculty member from the International Association for Applied Control Theory conducts each four-day session. Faculty have a broad range of experience

and include educators, school and private practice counselors, authors, speakers, consultants, executive coaches, and entrepreneurs.

## REGISTRATION DETAILS

**Tuition, accommodations, and meals.** Tuition for each Intensive Seminar is \$590 per participant, which includes all teaching materials. Participants are responsible for hotel accommodations, if needed, and meals. Due to limited space, payment must accompany registration.

**Cancellation policy.** Registrants who cancel *more than 21 days before the start of the seminar* will be refunded the registration fee less a \$15 processing charge. Registrants who cancel *less than 21 days before the start of the seminar* will be refunded 50 percent of the registration fee. Registrants who *fail to show at the seminar* will forfeit all of the registration fee. New View allows substitutions for any registrant at any time; please notify us of any substitutions.

**Professional credit.** Participants may receive professional credit for attending these Intensive Seminars but are responsible for negotiating credit hours or units with their school or organization.

**Daily schedule.** The Intensive Seminars will begin daily at 8:30 am and end at 3:30 pm (with a break for lunch) on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. On Thursday, the Intensive Seminars will end by 1:00 pm. Participants must attend the *entire* session in order to receive credit for participation.
